#### How URI was born in MENA

In March 2002, a delegation from MENA accepted URI invitation to participate in a URI meeting in Berlin, Germany.

The MENA participants were inspired by the way URI brought the best wisdom of the world's diverse spiritual traditions to guide peace lovers across the globe on their journey to make our world better place for all.



#### URI is about:

- Appreciating the uniqueness of all traditions.
- Working at a grassroot level.
- Embracing all "everyone is welcome".
- Hearing the voices that not often heard.
- Sharing wisdom and resources.
- Stopping violence in the name of religion.
- Creating cultures of peace and justice.

"In short; URI is about empowering people and encouraging them to contribute to the world's efforts of making our world better place for mankind and all living beings".



This life-changing experience encouraged MENA participants to join URI. As a result, a small URI community of seven URI Cooperation Circles (CCs – URI's member groups) was created in MENA during the year 2002. In eight years, this community has grown to include 47 CCs, with more than 600 members, from 12 countries across MENA.



URI member groups are engaged in different activities on local, regional and global levels, including peace building, intercultural understanding, civil society building, and environment protection.

URI in MENA has succeeded in deepening understanding and cooperation among the historic faith communities in MENA as well as empowering youth initiatives to play a vital role in building their societies..



# URI Regional office in Amman

- Provide a venue for all MENA CCs, where they can meet, develop projects, conduct seminars and workshops ...etc.
- legitimate the work of URI CCs in the region.
- Organize regional and cross-border assemblies. The office organizes a yearly conference inviting representatives from all URI CC in MENA region (about 50 participants attend the conference every year).
- Help CCs in fund raising.
- Organize cross-CC activities.
- Organize a monthly capacity building activity (e.g. workshops on soft skills), film screening, community service events...etc.





