## INTRODUCTION

Visionaries, Inc., is a nonprofit educational organization dedicated to producing and distributing media that inspires individuals and communities to take action for positive social change. We are delighted that URI is featured in the 24th Season of the Visionaries documentary series available as of the summer/fall 2020. It highlights the history of URI and the work of Cooperation Circles (CCs) in the global network for peace, justice, and healing through stories of CC members, staff, and partners from different parts of the world. This video is a part of a 3-year partnership between URI, Visionaries, and The Foundation for Religious Literacy to support CCs and their storytelling capabilities.



#### WHAT IS URI?

URI is United Religions Initiative, a global grassroots interfaith network that cultivates peace and justice by engaging people to bridge religious and cultural differences and work together for the good of their communities and the world.



#### WHAT IS VISIONARIES?

Visionaries, Inc. is a nonprofit educational organization dedicated to producing and distributing media that inspires individuals and communities to take action for positive social change.

### **HOW TO USE THE FILM**

### Host a screening

- Host digital screenings
  - o On social media as a Facebook Live feature.
  - o On Zoom for meetings, conferences, fundraisers, etc.
  - o On Facebook as a Watch Party, or on other social media platforms.
  - Potential audiences can include:
    - Members of your CC, to then discuss as a group.
    - Members of your CC, and ask everyone to bring a friend.
    - Partner with another CC from your region to watch together then have a follow-up.

- Members of a group you'd like to partner with in your community work.
- Members of a group you think might be interested in becoming a CC.
- Family & friends.
- Host in-person meetings
  - Assuming that COVID-19 has eased significantly enough for people to meet in person, people can use the film for meetings, conferences, fundraisers, etc.

### Have a conversation

- Refer to the Discussion Questions below.
- Host dialogue around topics like civic engagement, grassroots work, shared values and experiences, storytelling, etc. in relation to the film.
  - Invite URI colleagues to join or facilitate the conversation with you.
- Think about the ways in which you understand collaboration and cooperation with communities of different backgrounds. What values and experiences do you share? What are some things that are different?

#### **Connect with others**

- Connect with the CCs and regions from the film (host a regional screening or community calls around the film and invite CCs as speakers).
- Find CCs and organizations doing work that address similar topics in your region or globally. Build relationships with them. Can the film help with that?
- Find local faith communities, non-governmental organizations, and advocacy groups and discuss possibilities for dialogue, brainstorming, and action. What shared actions are possible?

### Make a difference

- With inspiration from Visionaries, think about some topics and ideas and develop projects about them:
  - How do you think about action in the midst of COVID-19 and beyond?
  - How can you create impact without putting peoples' health at risk?
  - How can you act virtually?
- What is possible?
  - o Invite people to act individually and collectively on issues.
  - Create spaces for contemplation and mindfulness.
  - Raise funds for important causes.
  - Advocate for communities adversely impacted by current conditions.
  - Write letters, make phone calls, express your opinions to relevant officials.
  - Educate yourselves. Your Regional Coordinator can help with resources to do that.



# DISCUSSION QUESTIONS ABOUT THE FILM

- Take a moment to reflect on what you've just watched:
  - How do you feel? How did you resonate with the stories featured in the film?
  - Was there a story that really inspired you? If so, what made it stand out?
- How does this film change your perception of the impact of grassroots work?
- How has it changed your perspective on inclusion and involvement in the interfaith movement?
- If you are a CC member you are a part of this global network that is making change. You can connect with CCs from other countries related to the work you are doing.
  - How might you do that? What does this film make you want to do? Does it inspire any actions you'd like to take?
- Do you know anyone else who might like to see this film?

# AFTER YOU'VE SEEN THE FILM, WHAT'S NEXT?

- How you can use this film to educate, inspire, and mobilize others to get involved in interfaith community-building work?
  - Host screenings that invite community members, CCs, and others to participate.
  - Learn about other CCs in URI's global network.
    - At uri.org you can search for CCs by country or topic.
    - Reach out to another CC somewhere in the world to connect with them.
  - Share the film on social media (Use the hashtag #URIVisionaries).

### **SHOWING THE FILM ONLINE**

#### On Facebook

Watch Party is a way for people to watch videos on Facebook together at the same time. When you create a Watch Party, participants can watch videos, live or recorded, and interact with one another around them in the same moment.

- 1.Go to your Facebook Page for your Cooperation Circle.
- 2. Click in the Write a Post... box to open the box that allows you to write a post.
- 3. Click [...] at the bottom of the box to find more options.
- 4. Click Watch Party.
- **5**. Click **Add Video**. You can search for a video or click a tab such as Watched, Group, Live, Saved, or Suggested to view additional videos. The Page tab will show videos from your own Page.
- 6. Click Add to Queue next to any videos you'd like to add to your watch party.
  - a. Optional: Click View Queue to view your playlist before going live.
- 7. Click Done.
- 8. You can add a title and a description for your watch party. Note that this can only be done from a computer right now.
- 9. Click Post. You'll see a message that says "Your Watch party Is About To Begin."
  - **a.** If you want to schedule the Watch Party, you will have the option to do so in the **Creator Studio** of your page. There's an option to do that in the Post section. It will open a new page and you can do the same steps as above by clicking on the **Create Post** button on the top left corner of the page.
- 10. Once the video is over, you can close the post.

#### On Zoom

- 1. Start your Zoom meeting.
- **2**. At the bottom of your screen in the Zoom window, you'll see a button that says **Share Screen**. Click on it.
- **3**. You will see options for which screen you want to share. Click on the screen that is showing the Visionaries film.
- **4**. At the bottom of the Screen Scare window, there will be an option to **Optimize for full-screen video clip**. Click on the box next to this option.
- **5**. At the bottom of the Screen Share window, there will be an option to **Share computer sound**. Click on the box next to this option.
- 6. Click on Share Screen at the bottom right corner of that window.
- 7. Zoom will take you to the window where the video is. You can now play the video for others to watch.
- 8. When you're done, you will see a **Settings bar** with a red button that says **End Screen Share**. Click on it to go back to your Zoom meeting.

### Important Details to Note

#### • For Facebook:

- When playing videos, you can control the quality of the video by click on the Gear button at the bottom right of the video. You'll get an option to change the video quality; we would recommend that you play the video at a 720p level of video quality so it plays better for people watching in the Watch Party.
- You can do a few additional things to keep yourself engaged with people watching the video:
  - Click Add Video to add additional videos to the queue.
  - Click Write something... on the right from a web browser or below the video on mobile to chat with your friends who are in the Watch Party with you. You can click to add emojis and GIFs to your comments.
  - Use Host Controls to rewind, fast forward, pause, or skip to the next video in your queue. When
    you do this, it controls the playback for everyone in the Watch Party.
  - See who's watching the film with you at the bottom of your Watch Party video.

#### For Zoom

 When playing videos on Zoom, you can control the quality of the video on Youtube, Vimeo, and other video players by checking the bar at the bottom of the video for any settings. You'll get an option to change the video quality; we would recommend that you play the video at a 480p level of video quality so it plays better for people watching in Zoom.
