URI is

a network of 1,111 Cooperation Circles (CCs), Individual Members, and Supporting Members, in 118 countries, forming a community of **250,000** members.

These members are from more than 340 different religions, spiritual expressions, and indigenous traditions.

Together, all are actively engaged in working, learning, and changing their communities through efforts in 4 Action Areas such as the environment, education, and women's empowerment.

The world today is experiencing the consequences of human-made actions that have disrupted biodiversity and the ecosystem. Extreme weather conditions, wildfires, floods, hurricanes, and heat waves are affecting each region of the world. This is a call to action from Mother Nature.

URI member groups (Cooperation Circles) are heeding this call, working together to restore biodiversity.

In Malawi, the Wildlife and Natural
Resources Conservation and Rehabilitation
Trust CC has planted over 3,200 seedlings in a
move to conserve the Lilongwe River catchment
area through afforestation; Nthora CC has
planted 500+ trees to combat floods. Green
Hope Foundation CC and indigenous women
are planting fruit trees in Peru; North India's
HEENA Rural Women Development CC
provides water to animals. Global Compassion
CC in Cameroon partnered with West Los Angeles

Children's Choir to fundraise for the installation of three safe water points in Bamia village.

These and other initiatives by CCs around the world demonstrate that by working together, Cooperation Circles can mitigate the negative impacts of environmental degradation and climate change to help restore and protect Mother Earth.

World Interfaith Harmony Week (WIHW) is celebrated the world over every first week of February to promote harmony among people irrespective of their faith. The initiative is based on the purpose of promoting "Love of God and Love of the Neighbor, or Love of the Good and Love of the Neighbor."

This year, URI regional coordinators held four cross-regional virtual events all connected to celebrating World Interfaith Harmony Week.

People from different countries and regions participated in these virtual events which included:

The Intercontinental Interfaith Quiz, Stories for an Open Heart, Magic of Food Festival, and Harmony in Diversity, an interreligious and intercultural, art, music, and food festival.

The events provided Cooperation Circles, Individual Members, and donors a great opportunity to strengthen their relationships, learn from each other, connect, and appreciate the impact of cross-regional collaboration.







For players and spectators, sport is a unifying activity that brings together people from across backgrounds.

URI Cooperation Circles in different regions of the world have harnessed sports and leveraged their power to unite people of different religions, ages, genders and cultural backgrounds.

Cooperation Circle member groups **Dwarka Peace Society CC** in North India, **Building Blocks for Peace Foundation CC** in Nigeria, **Pakigdait Inc. CC** in the Philippines, **Spotlight**

CC in Yemen, AYICRIP CC in Nigeria, and Sahas CC in India organized local sports events like football/soccer, basketball, tug of war and footraces. These occasions aim at fostering peace, tolerance, harmony, empowerment, relationships, and genuine reconciliation.

Sports activities from various Cooperation Circles highlight the possibility of creating positive change through teamwork and healthy competition.




